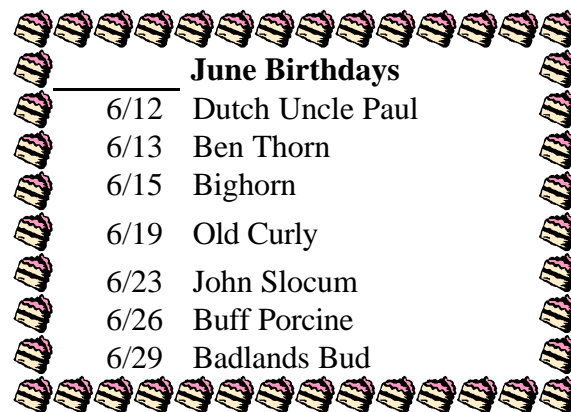

31 May 2000

Howdy, Folks !!

Hope y'all had a great Memorial Weekend !!

WOW !! We had 52 cowfolk come out to shoot the match on Sunday, 28 May !! That's our 3rd largest turnout EVER !!!! 10 of those shooters were new - WELCOME to Faultline !!

Again, we tried a different stage layout - although similar to our Easter match, we made some changes - moved the firing line back 3-4 yards, extended it a bit, and spread out the stages a bit more . . . and we also turned around some of the targets that got hung backwards last month. The result was ALOT less lead splatter and more room to move. It also provided us with an unexpected bonus - a "spectators' gallery" along the creek bank !! We're thinking at this point that some variation of this layout will be used for Adobe Walls 2K. We "borrowed" most of our stages this month from other clubs' annual matches (with some minor modifications to make them "ours"). However, the gents' favorite & ladies' least favorite (the one with all the shotgun) was written and submitted by our very own Record editor, one Bodie Camp. We also used it as an "anchor" for the names and scenarios for the rest of the stages. Thanks, Bodie. The stage with the flyers was dreamed up by yours truly (we were gonna "wing it" at set-up, but I thought a brief scenario was in order to set it up).

Thank you to the folks who came out to help set up - the usual suspects were joined by Old Buckaroo and Concho Gal - two of our new members !! And our "usual" take-down crew was augmented by Bandoleer Bonnie (she worked harder than some of the gents!), Springfield Slim, Tom Doodley-Squat, Peaceful Jones and Cubby Bear. The "usual suspects" are my very own Black Jack Traven, Badlands Bud, Sedona Sue, Quicksilver Kid (and sometimes his kids), and Powder Bags.

If YOU would like to take a more active part in Faultline, we'd love to have you. We have Match Planning Committee meetings on the monday evenings before the matches - they're at Quicksilver Kid's house in Mountain View. We're ALWAYS looking for stages - please submit them to me. They should include the ammo

onto Olympia, WA where we had a great meal and motel beds. The next day it was on to Sequim, WA to thank a friend of mine for hiring me to Lockheed and for the successful career and to eat his steaks and drink some of the Scotch we had brought him from CA. The Clatterwagon clattered flawlessly the entire trip and earned a respectable 21 MPG average at over 80 MPH. One thing still puzzles me though, I paid \$1.34 for diesel fuel in Afton, WY. and \$1.69 for similar fuel in Sacramento, CA!! It was nice to leave but nicer to come home!! During the course of my drive about I kept in touch with various members of the club's officers and not all was paradise. Seems some members of the club were not pleased with the range set up due to excessive splatter. Let me explain. Everything the FSS officers do relative to monthly matches, match planning etc. is with the thought of improving Adobe Walls, our annual match. Each year one or more people have had to be carried back to their car/truck/camp due to heat prostration....it gets really warm out on the range in September. So, one of the ways to cut down on the heat is to cut down on the walking necessary to shoot the match. As is, the range is over a quarter mile long with up hills and down hills all for five or six stages. So, those members attending Match Planning Committee meetings came up with the thought of making the entire range on flat ground!! A string was strung taught between a point near the rifle shooting benches and the road by Boot Hill. That line would become the 180 degree line and five stages were set up along that line. However, this being the first time to set up the range this way a couple of errors were made: the stages were a little too close together and the targets, now veterans of several month's of matches were hung with the concave surface facing the shooter instead of the convex side, ergo some splatter. Further, I was advised that "many" members felt they were being slighted by the club officers on several counts. I would like to submit: if any member of FSS feels he/she is being slighted for any reason, please talk to ME, Cheapshot, directly by phone, e mail, smoke signal, however, and I promise your concern(s) will be addressed and you will get feed back if not total satisfaction within forty eight hours. During the May general meeting I was made aware that a club member was instructed to keep his hand down by a speaker until the speaker was through. This member got so upset he left the meeting. I was not that speaker nor was I in attendance at that meeting but I submit my deepest apology to that club member and am em-

barrassed that the situation occurred.

Ladies and gentlemen, the FSS is a shooting club dedicated to the sport Cowboy Action Shooting. To be a club member only requires a small some of money due and payable on the first of March. To be an active member requires you to attend and shoot at monthly matches and to attend an occasional meeting. To be a contributing member requires you to pay your dues, shoot at monthly matches, attend business meetings, attend Match Planning Committee meetings and help in the set up and tear down of the range on match days. To be considered FSS member of the year requires all the aforementioned as well as a hell of a lot of work during the planning and range preparation for Adobe Walls and not be an officer. Now, here's the kicker, not many people attend the monthly business meetings or the Match Planning Committee meetings. The officers of FSS realize that not everyone can drive to Santa Clara, or Sunnyvale to attend an hour's meeting on the second Monday of every month. So, to assist more members to attend general business meetings, the meetings will, starting with the June meeting, be conducted directly after the monthly match at the range. After the meeting long distance shooting will/may commence, depending on time of day, weather, etc. This new schedule will be used until such time that a better schedule can be adopted.

This month's match, conducted during the Memorial Day holiday and the same week end as High Sierra, was a resounding success!! There were fifty shooters on hand including five or seven newbies and many observers who will sooner or later come play with us. The range was set up similarly to the way it was for the April match but with the mistakes corrected and the membership concerns addressed. There was no splatter to speak of and "everyone" appreciated not having to walk to Dead Man's Walk and back. I personally was told that the MPC had done an outstanding job and I agree.
