A Few Words from the Mayor of Faultline

Well, Adobe Walls 2000 has come and gone and everyone had a good time. I won't dwell on Adobe Walls since I know Montana Maggie Hunter will cover that. I want to talk about something else for this issue of The Record: the future of The Faultline Shootist Society. However, there is one thing I would like to mention about Adobe Walls. On Sunday, during the drawings for prizes I mistakenly credited Oregon Trail/Laser Cast for some bullets that were won by a shooter. Well, I messed up. These bullets were donated by Carlos El Hombre and Literary Lue and not OT/LC. I apologize for the mix up. These two fine members of FSS deserved the credit for that particular draw.

Several years ago I bought a Remington 1100 in 12ga. , a Marlin 1894CS and a Ruger 10/22 from a widow woman in Gilroy, CA. I got what I considered a pretty good deal. Later, she gave a bunch of reloading equipment to her moonlighting attorney who worked for me at the Rocket Ranch. He, the attorney, had no use for the reloading equipment, so, he gave it to me. Another good deal. The equipment was new RCBS stuff plus two thousand 158gr. .38spl lead. It sat on my workbench for months since I didn't know poop about reloading. One day whilst prowling the magazine stand at the Prunedale Safeway I ran across a magazine, Shooting Times, that said some pistols shoot the same ammo as some rifles. I thought this was cool. Then I saw an add for SASS....a cowboy shooting club, I think. I haven't been the same since!!!!

A few days later, while at work and during one of those mind dulling moments when everything is caught up, I went into the internet and brought up the SASS homepage and the then Virtual Posse. I read what I could and determined it would be fun to join a club like the ones on the SASS page. So, I went into the Virtual Posse and started looking for someone close by who could tell me what I needed to know. I found a woman in Palo Alto. I contacted her and introduced myself. She allowed that she had only been shooting for a few months and had also wanted to join a club but there weren't any in the bay area. She said she was considering starting a club if she could get some members. I said, "Let's do it." Several weeks later we had our first meeting at her brother in law's home. There were three people in attendance. The woman, her name is Elegant Ella., her brother in-law and me. Several weeks later we had our second meeting at Emperor Norton's Pizza joint, there were five or six people in attendance including O. T. Hill, Tennessee Jed, Elegant Ella. The neophyte club continued to have meetings and more and more people started coming. The club had named itself The Silly Valley Safety Committee but it didn't have any targets. So Elegant Ella invested over a thousand dollars of her own money to buy targets. The next order of business was to find a range at which to conduct the club's matches. After searching high and low in Santa Clara Co. the club determined there just wasn't any interest in Santa Clara Co. so it went outside the county. It soon was welcomed at the Richmond Rifle Range in Richmond, CA. The club's schedule was for six matches a year conducted every other month and we were on our way!! During this time club rules and by laws were developed, affiliation with SASS and NRA insurance was established and an ad hoc board of directors managed the club

affairs. The president was Elegant Ella, I was the vice president, Tennessee Jed was the Treasurer and O. T. Hill was the secretary. From that time to the present the club has been dynamic. It had its first official election meeting at the Sunnyvale Rod and Gun Club one year after the meeting at Elegant Ella's brother in-law's house. During that meeting Elegant Ella was elected President, I was elected vice president, Tennessee Jed was elected Treasurer, Bodacious Kate was elected Secretary, Gila Bob was elected Territorial Governor, Coyote Creek Mike was elected Sheriff and Rico Fardan was elected Trail Boss. The club's name was also changed during that meeting to The Faultline Shootist Society.

Over the years many things have changed and many things have happened. Some for the good and some not so good. During the club's first years it needed a lot of help from its members. Some members tried to help but were not acknowledged. Some helped but were not thanked or appreciated. Some wanted to help but were berated or admonished and therefore didn't and left the club. As in most gatherings of people with the same interest but different perceptions, internal politics soon started to rear its ugly head and take its unaccountable toll. However, there were those members who stuck with the club through thick and thin. After some time and I'm not even going to try to remember exact dates, the club was able to meet and negotiate a plan with the Swiss of the Monterey County Swiss Rifle Club. That plan is part of what is enjoyed by the FSS today. In the mean time the club, which had been holding its monthly meetings at the National Shooting Club in Santa Clara, moved to the Sunnyvale Rod and Gun Club and eventually to the Machado Park Recreation building in Sunnyvale. Many thanks go to Big Horn and his family for arranging this new meeting spot.

But alas, everything must change. Many of the original members have left the club for various reasons: some have moved out of town/state, some have decided to shoot at ranges closer to their residences, some left because of the internal politics and, believe it or not, some gave up shooting altogether!! But there is a cadre of members who have continued to stick by the club. The club now has over 120 dues paying members. It has a forty-foot container in which the hundreds of targets, stands, props and other club owned property accumulated over the years is kept. The club has over \$8,000 in the bank and last year gave several generous contributions to charity at Christmas time. The club enjoys a healthy relationship with its hosts, the Swiss of the Monterey County Swiss Rifle Club and intends to continue this relationship for years to come. However, things always change; some for the good some for not so good.

This year, after Adobe Walls, The Faultline Shootist Society will take its biggest hit yet of dedicated members and club officers. As most of you know, The Sheriff, Black Jack Traven and the Trail Boss, Montana Maggie Hunter who used to live in Livermore have moved just a wee bit further away: to Rescue, CA. I know, I know; it's at the turn off by the old Sam's Town on highway 50 going to Placerville. The drive to any FSS event for these people is a little more than three hours...each way. So, they will commence being less active after the election of officers in March 2001. The Faultline Shootist Society has been very fortunate to have such dedicated and responsible members/officers for the

past few years. The Rubert family: Rod, Sharon, bers/officers for the past few years. The Rubert family: Rod, Sharon, Susie and Steven will continue to attend matches in the future. Thank you for all you have done.

Our Territorial Governor, Gila Bob has run into a bid of tough going in his career and may find himself moving out of state. Bob has done a yeoman's job of representing us at the Territorial Governor's meetings and bringing back the new and improved rules. I want to thank Gila Bob for all his efforts and wish him well.

As most of you know, I have recently retired from a long and successful career in the aerospace industry. I also have been shooting my mouth off about wanting to move to the Bitterroot Valley of Montana. Well, if you look at your maps the Bitterroot Valley has burnt up. However, in August I found, reviewed, photographed, shared with Ms. Sherrill, and bought a property in Powell, Wyoming. I have purchased a 2.9 acre, 2240 sq. ft. house with four bedrooms and two inside bathrooms located 3.5 miles west of Powell. The place is in the country with few close neighbors around. I have already contacted a local contractor and negotiated for a 30X40 shop to be built with a special place for reloading, etc. Powell is twenty-two miles from Cody, WY. The movers will be coming to move us the 3rd of October.

I too will be leaving the Faultline Shootist Society before the elections in March. I have made many, many good friends whom I shall never forget. It's time for me to move on and it's now time for the remaining members of the Executive Board to come up to the line and see that this fine club continues to flourish and prosper. This club is heavy with leadership talent and with what I call mules: people who do hard, hot work for the joy of helping the club. This club is also heavy with what I call project people: people who when given or volunteer for an assignment do the job in a timely and quality manner with little or not intervention from "management". I don't need to name these people, you know who you/they are. It's now time for these people to step up to the line and make this club go some more. It's not that hard. All it takes is patience, honesty, integrity and a sense of humor because after all is said and done: This is only a game and we will have fun safely.

I have been very lucky to have had the opportunity to work and play with the membership and Executive Board of this club. I plan to continue to play with them but on a reduced basis and from further away. Thank you.
