Additionally, a similar match could be arranged for a "Lever Action Invitational", 20 rounds, 200 points. Finish around 2:00pm. How 'bout it, anyone interested?

A Few Words from the Mayor

Well folk, after ten or so years of running my mouth about wanting to leave Kalifornia, I have. The reality of not living in familiar surroundings was short lived. On October 3st, a big, white Atlas moving van pulled up to the curb next to our condo in Santa Clara. Three men leaped there from and commenced loading Ms. Sherrill's and my personal belongings into the truck. Already loaded in the truck were the personal belongings that had been in long term storage for over two and a half years. Ya see, we had sold a home in Prunedale, CA and moved to the condo in Santa Clara. We moved just enough "stuff"; to set up house keeping in the condo whilst planning our retirement and the rest went into long term storage and it was this stuff that was in the van. Stuff like: my motor scooter, my compressor, drill press, work benches, roll away tool box, two VW engines, grinder, gas welding bottles, cherry picker engine crane, engine stands, jack stands, floor jack and a bunch of junk Ms. Sherrill had stored along with my treasures. The Atlas men worked with great diligence not to scrape, mash or break any of the furniture and/or family heirlooms we have....(note, a \$25 picture bought at Kmart becomes a family heirloom if damaged by the movers and the value instantly rockets into the thousands of dollars, don't ya see?

However, the movers were very careful not to damage anything.....darn.)

The day before the arrival of the big, white Atlas moving van I had carefully loaded all my shooters, powder, primers and personal records into the Clatterwagon. I knew the movers wouldn't take the powder/primers and I didn't want them "messaging" with my shooters. So, when the van arrived I was actually ready to leave for Wyoming. However, I was under orders not to leave until we were sure there would be no problems with moving anything down the stairs of the condo e.g., gun safe, work bench, etc. About three hours after the mover guys arrived we caught the cats I was to carry three cats to WY, put them in the cage in the rear of the Clatterwagon and blasted off. At 11:30 A. M. on October 3th, I was on my way out of Kalifornia!! Now folk, ya know how nervous ya can git when going to a CAS match with your shooters in your ride? There are horror stories of innocent people carrying shooters who get stopped by Kalifornia's finest and lose them to the "justice system", etc. etc. Well, I gotta tellya, I was more than just a little nervous whilst heading to Nevada with my load !! I had enough fire power in the Clatterwagon to start, and win, several small wars in any of several third world countries. I figgered if I got stopped by "the man"; I would probably spend the rest of my miserable life in some nice, air conditioned jail being someone's fat, bald girlfriend.....!! The four hour drive to the Nevada/Kalifornia State line took an eternity. But, alas, the Nevada State line was soon behind me and I relaxed for the rest of the trip since the roads are decidedly smoother once the state line is crossed. I "wicked" up the Clatterwagon to a smooth, harmonious 85-MPH and waited until I got to Elko, NV.

I arrived in Elko around eight o'clock, checked into a motel and went to supper. I had supper in a fine Basque restaurant. After a fine steak I "serviced" the cats and went to

bed. Four A.M. the next morning found me on Highway 80 east bound into Salt Lake City, UT cruising at a steady 84 MPH. I stopped in Evanston, WY for lunch and in Rock Springs for fuel. However, these two laners are smooth, wide and the prima fascia speed limit is 65 MPH with bursts to 70. The drive up Wyoming from Rock Springs to the Shoshone National Forest isn't the scenic view route unless counting Pronghorns is one's favorite driving sport. There is no radio worth listening to unless one enjoys twenty-plus years old Country and Western music. However, once in the Shoshone Nat'l Forest the scenery is beautiful !!! This scenery continues all the way through Riverton, Shoshoni, Thermopolis, Cody and to my new home in Powell. I arrived in Powell around 1900 on October 4rd and immediately checked into the local (cheap) motel and "died"

The next day, being Thursday, I went to my friend's house, roused him out of bed and went to Cody where I began my transformation from Kalifornian to non-Kalifornian: I got my WY driver license, the Clatterwagon a new set of license plates and registered to vote. The entire process took no more than two hours.

The big, white Atlas moving van arrived on Saturday morning. However, this time four men leaped there from and commenced disloading our personal belongings. I stood on the stoop and gave hand signals as to whether something went into the garage or the house and where in the house. About an hour after the disloading ceremony started a large, lumberyard sized forklift arrived. It was being driven by one of the local maidens: blond, 5'9", 180 lbs., pretty smile, clear eyes, smooth complexion, zero fat and tougher than a boot. She had driven the fork lift all the way from Powell, approx. 3.5 miles with the temperature at about 38 degrees F!! The big, white Atlas moving van driver had thought ahead and arranged for the forklift to unload my gun safes.....The young Amazon unloaded the safes and drove off into the sunrise. Several hours later the four men of the big, white Atlas moving van were through with their chores and they too drove off into the sunrays. I was now left with the daunting task of figuring out where Ms. Sherrill wanted all this stuff!!!!
